






Results - Data/Observations (Continued)

Additionally, once again, the land portion of the test increased much more than air and water, while air and water were the same. Lastly, we ran the S.A.I. test, and found that the air als of a forcease, the land had 5 Forcease, and the water had a 4° F increase. Even this time, we noticed a similar change in the water than a more than a 3° Forcease. This test also had a positive impact on the model. However, atthough and still had a higher increase than air and water, the temperature changes were similar, demonstrating how stratespheric aerosol injections, being able to spread more evenly, could regulate the temperatures more than space mirroring. Another factor we utilized to evaluate each method was cost fedctworess. Before running our tests, we calculated that if our model (Tore) instance, '100 miles' 20 of the Earth, in order to send a small shellfe with a mirror his size, it would require at least \$400 million per setaltile. Since we used to the more, we calculated the entire space mirroring process cost to be roughly \$6.4 billion. On the other hand, each kinetic on of sulfate aerosol would be around \$1500, and the entire operation would end up being around \$4 billion. In this case, \$A.I. is more cost effective than space mirroring.



Humanities Embedded Honors Program



Honors Designation

 Upon successful completion of honors requirements, students will receive an honors designation on their academic records on a trimester basis.



Why Embedded Honors?



- It is socially just! All students get a shot at Honors, not just a select few.
- The body of research on student grouping: heterogeneous grouping, the placement of students of mixed abilities into one classroom, increases academic achievement more than other groupings.
- Tracking (grouping of students by skill) does not work- it's "old school."
- Provides Honors access for all students when they are developmentally ready for Honors. Students can "opt in" at any trimester. Honors assignments and challenges are offered throughout the year.
- This is a movement with momentum in IUSD as several other schools are either implementing or preparing to implement the model and will become the district honors model in the future!



- All students will be offered challenging and engaging extension activities.



WHAT IS UDL?

UDL is Universal Design for Learning, an education framework based on decades of research in neuroscience and endorsed by the Every Student Succeeds Act. UDL is considered best practice for teaching all students in an inclusive learning environment.







Light language support is provided in grade level, mainstream classes. ELD 3 Support elective class for ELD instruction. Zero period PE is an option if a 2nd elective is desired.


