



Mediums may include graphite, tempera and acrylic paint, watercolor, and more.



Course Description

Photojournalism is a year-long course that provides an introduction to the art and principles of digital photography and how to use original photography to tell a story. Students will learn to use different software applications, including PhotoShop, to enhance and manipulate photos.

With the help of publishing software, students will use their photography and writing skills to create the design and layout of our annual yearbook. Students should be proficient writing and in using computers, and have some experience with or interest in using photo editing and/or publishing software.

Because Yearbook students work collaboratively within groups and with the advisor to create the school yearbook, this course requires that students are creative, work well in a self-directed classroom, and are able to meet established timelines for completion of work. Students are responsible for using digital cameras to take pictures at school events and for using computers to design the yearbook, including layouts, photos, captions and more. Students enrolled in this class must be self-motivated and responsible for effectively managing their time.
